

SFEDI Awards Level 1 Award in Enterprising Skills and Employability - 600/5462/1

OVERVIEW

Who is this qualification for?

This qualification is part of a suite of Enterprise Skills Development qualifications aimed at those learners who wish to have the opportunity to explore the skills required within enterprise and by an 'entrepreneur', and further explore these through developing important employability skills. The Award is suitable for Level 1 learners who may not yet be ready or able to study a certificate size qualification, but who would benefit from a short course covering the basic elements of enterprise and employability skills.

What prior qualifications/levels of attainment does a learner need to take this qualification? Are there any age restrictions?

This qualification is aimed at 16-18 year old learners as well as those aged over 19, ie both young people and adults.

There are no formal entry requirements however, in order to benefit from undertaking the qualification; you should at least possess communication skills sufficient enough to allow you to meet the assessment requirements.

What does this qualification cover?

This is a QCF regulated qualification containing one core unit and sixteen optional units. You will probably need to do at least three of the optional units in addition to the core unit to complete your qualification. The core unit covers:

- Being Safe and Healthy at Work

WHAT COULD THIS QUALIFICATION LEAD TO?

Will the qualification lead to employment, and if so, in which job role and at what level?

The qualification will help you identify the characteristics of being a successful entrepreneur and understand your own strengths as an enterprising person and how to improve your enterprise skills. This in turn will give you crucial employability skills which all employers look for so this qualification could help you to get your first job or get back into the job market.

Will the qualification support progression to further learning, if so, what to?

If you would benefit from further development of your enterprise skills, you could progress to the Level 1 Certificate in Enterprising Skills and Employability which is a larger qualification with a greater choice of units. You could also progress to a higher level such as the Level 2 which allows you to explore your enterprising abilities even further or start to explore the practical elements of setting up in business by doing one of the Creating and Starting Your Business qualifications either at Level 1 or Level 2.

SFEDI Awards offers a range of qualifications within our Enterprise Skills Development series that support the development of transferable employability and enterprise skills so there may be other options to explore.

You could also progress into any other vocational learning of your choice and do other qualifications.

If there are larger and/or smaller versions of this qualification at the same Level, why should a learner take this particular one?

The Enterprise Skills Development qualifications come in different sizes and levels which are designed to be flexible and adaptable to each learner's needs. The most appropriate qualification will be determined at initial assessment with the learning provider.
